Dear Prospective Residents and Fellows,

Thank you for your interest in the University of Washington!

We are proud to train over 1500 residents and fellows participating in over 120 Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME)-accredited, 4 Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA)-accredited dental programs, and over 80 non-ACGME accredited training programs across 300 training sites throughout the 5-state Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana, and Idaho (WWAMI) region. We value our trainees' service and believe we provide some of the best clinical training in the world.

As the Designated Institutional Official for the University of Washington School of Medicine, it is my job to ensure that our programs have the resources they need to support their curricula, faculty to create an excellent clinical learning environment, and trainees who are integrated into the quality and safety efforts of our hospitals and clinics. I am extremely proud of our training programs and the talented residents and fellows we attract to the beautiful Pacific Northwest.

Most of our residents and fellows in ACGME and CODA-accredited programs are represented by the Resident & Fellow Physician Union-Northwest (RFPU-NW). The third collective bargaining agreement between the University of Washington and the RFPU-NW was ratified in July 2022 and is effective through the end of June 2025. This contract provides RFPU-NW members with a 3% salary increase each year, an allowance for additional expenses like housing, a professional development fund, license reimbursement, and other financial benefits.
